How wide should a photovoltaic roof be?

They are required to be not less than 36 in. (914 mm) wide and run from the gutter to the ridge. At a minimum, two access pathways must be provided on separate planes of the roof. One access pathway must be on the street or driveway side. There must be an access pathway in close proximity to the roof plane containing photovoltaic panels.

PV and solar panels help reduce your energy bills and combat the emission of greenhouse gases. What's more, their prices have dropped by about 70%. For homeowners, roof-mounted solar panels present a great way of harnessing the sun's energy. But before installing panels, your roof must meet specific requirements.

Installers must only fit solar panels if they're sure your roof can hold their weight, and carry on doing so for up to 40 years. Fortunately, most roofs in the UK are built to hold much more than a solar panel system, which usually weigh around 20kg per square metre when everything's included.

Solar panels are built to work in all climates, but in some cases, rooftops may not be suitable for solar systems due to age or tree cover. If there are trees near your home that create excessive shade on your roof, rooftop panels may not be the most ideal option. The size, shape, and slope of your roof are also important factors to consider.

There are a number of well-proven solutions to connect the solar panels to your roof. Most solutions fix the solar panels above the existing roof tiles on aluminium rails, but some solutions allow for an integrated, "flush", connection where the roof tiles are removed and replaced with the solar panels. The amount of setback depends on how much of the roof is covered by the panels. When the panels cover 33 percent or less of the plan view roof area, the panels must be set back from the ridge at least 18 in. (457 mm). When the panels cover more than 33 percent of the roof, the setback is increased to a minimum of 36 in. (914 mm).

Solar PV panels are most commonly installed on the roof. Ground-mounted structures are usually more expensive to install and occupy significant amounts of space. Roof installations generally require less wiring to connect to the building, and are less susceptible to tampering and damage than ground- or carport-mounted solar arrays.

Even if the roof does not allow for a perfect orientation, an appropriate tilt angle for the panels can compensate for this drawback. In Poland, it is recommended that the tilt angle of the modules ranges from 25 to 50 degrees, depending on the geographical location. ...
