Are solar panels a fire hazard?

Even though there are no clear statistics on fires caused by rooftop PV systems in the United States, a solar system suddenly bursting into flames is rare. Based on a report detailing fire risks in Germany, 48% of solar panel-related fires are caused by the system itself.

Are solar panels combustible?

Even if the roof has a non-combustible metal surface, the insulation underneath could present a fire risk. If LPS 1181 or FM-approved panels are installed, their fire resistance is typically tested without solar panels on top. When installed with solar panels, the roof panels must be treated as combustible due to the potential increased fire risk.
