Do I need a power adapter in Portugal?

If your devices are compatible with these specifications, you will not need a power adapter. However, if your devices use a different plug type or are not compatible with the voltage in Portugal, you will need a power adapter and/or a voltage converter/transformer. The standard voltage in Portugal is 230 V, and the standard frequency is 50 Hz.

What types of power plugs are used in Portugal?
