What happens if you overload a power supply?

For the power supply I have in my lab, if I were to overload it, the output voltage would drop. So if my PSU could only supply 10A and I put 0.6 ohm load on 12V, the output would drop to 6V and the overcurrent LED would light up. Another supply I have at home though shuts off the output if overcurrent occurs.
