How many MW of solar projects did Croatia tender?

The Croatian authorities initially reviewed 144 projects totaling 713 MW for the auction. The tender was carried out in two phases. One awarded market premiums for projects with installed capacities of more than 1 MW each, including 350 MW of solar, 60 MW of wind, and 7.25 MW of hydropower.

How much does a solar tender cost in Croatia?

The first tender, with a budget of EUR10 million, will be aimed at installing residential solar arrays in the second quarter of 2025 and will cover up to 50% of the investment costs. Additionally, the Croatian authorities will announce a EUR25 million call to co-finance solar plants and heat pumps for the public sector in the second quarter.

It is the second round of auctions since Croatia introduced the renewable energy subsidy mechanism in mid-2020. It is "too slow" to get a utility-scale solar project in Croatia finalized, said Zvonimir Meštrović, head of solar business development at Zagreb-based renewable energy company ENCRO.

The company was selected to negotiate a grant decision for a subsidy of up to 107 million euros for its project consisting of a 200 MW electrolysis plant and a 50 MW heat pump system.
