Typical VRLA batteries in large UPS should be replaced after 5 years; depending on how they test & type of battery, it may be less time. Batteries contained in closed modules or small UPS should be replaced every

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three years or less. All batteries should be replaced if they test at 80% or less of rated backup time as part of a full discharge test.

Much wisdom here. The UPS self test should be done at least quarterly, and should give an indication when batteries need to be replaced. I'd budget to replace the batteries every three years or so. UPSes are pretty simple and reliable. In the last 20 years and for multiple companies, I have never replaced a UPS just because it was old.

Measure the ambient and negative-post temperatures for all battery cells and / or battery blocks. At the very least, you should have 10% checked to be on the safe side. Semi-Annual UPS maintenance. Twice a year you should have a qualified UPS service technician visit your premises to conduct the following:
