

Ireland's new energy and energy storage policy

What is Ireland's energy storage policy?

This is the first electricity storage policy published in Ireland. The Irish Government's Climate Action Plan 2021 set out the need for an energy storage policy for Ireland to support 75% reduction in power sector CO2 emissions by 2030.

What does the energy transition framework mean for Ireland?

The framework addresses the grid's immediate and near-term needs by supporting the incorporation of electricity storage from the immediate up until 2040 and presents 10 government actions to support the role of electricity storage systems in Ireland's energy transition, identifying the key stakeholders and timelines for these actions.

What is the electricity storage policy framework?

The first memo regarding the Electricity Storage Policy Framework sets out the actions to be taken in maximising the incorporation of available renewable electricity across the grid system, underpinning the role that ESS is expected to play in meeting the CAP targets and beyond, as well as its role in the electricity transition for Ireland.

Why should Ireland support energy storage?

By supporting energy storage Ireland can enable more renewable electricity on the grid, reduce our reliance on imported fossil fuels and our exposure to volatile gas commodity prices while significantly lowering our carbon emissions.

What is Ireland's energy storage framework?

The framework recognises that the energy storage landscape is rapidly evolving. While Ireland currently relies primarily on battery storage and the Turlough Hill Power Station in County Wicklow, new technologies are emerging that could play a key role in the future.
