

Poland's policy on adding energy storage to photovoltaic power generation

What are the new energy storage rules in Poland?

Poland's new rules state that energy storage facilities over 10MW require licensing to ensure they can provide services to Poland's National Power System. Facilities 10MW or smaller do not need licensing but do need to register with the transmission system operator or distribution system operator for their area.

Which storage facilities will be supported by Poland's energy policy?

The policy will support only newly installed storage facilities with a capacity of at least 4 MWh. Eligible projects will be connected to Poland's electricity distribution or transmission networks at all voltage levels.

How many GWh of energy storage capacity will Poland have by 2035?

In a bid to tackle the challenge of the growing electricity production from renewable energy sources, the Polish utility is looking to add more than 10 GWh of energy storage capacity by 2035. Its plans involve more than 80 projects, the value of which is estimated at around PLN 18 billion (\$4.7 billion).

Will Poland support new electricity storage facilities in 2024?

In an announcement released on October 3, 2024, the executive arm of the European Union said that the Polish scheme will support the installation of at least 5.4 GWh of new electricity storage facilities. The policy will support only newly installed storage facilities with a capacity of at least 4 MWh.

Can Poland co-finance electricity storage facilities?

Prior to the onset of the Covid-19 pandemic, Poland experienced a decade of strong economic growth. From 2010 to 2019, Poland's gross domestic product (GDP) increased by 38% and its economic growth rate was 4.7% in 2019, significantly higher than the European Union (EU) average of 1.5%.

In addition, on 1st April 2022, the billing system was changed from "net metering" (discount system) to "net billing", which is also an incentive for prosumers to install energy storage [8, 9]. The previous system made possible to transfer surplus energy to the power system, and then receive 70 or 80 % of this value (depending on the installation capacity) during the period ...

Under BNEF's LPS, Poland's coal-heavy power system has high generation costs, but shifts toward more cost-efficient technologies over time. By 2040, the power system is dominated by 37GW onshore wind and 83GW solar. This scenario sees annual PV additions of 2- 4GW per year, of which roughly half is rooftop solar.
