

Solar Energy in Türkiye

How much solar power will Türkiye have in 2035?

Although Türkiye has added 11 GW of wind and solar capacity in the last five years, other European countries have proved this is possible in a single year. According to the NEP, solar energy capacity is set to reach 52 GW in 2035. To meet this target, an annual average of 3.4 GW of new solar capacity is foreseen to be added.

What is solar energy in Turkey?

Solar Energy In Turkey Turkey is a European leader in solar and energy infrastructure. For example, the YEKA-1 solar power plant in Kalyon Karapınar represents a monumental achievement in renewable energy and is considered the largest of its kind in Europe.

How much wind power does Türkiye have?

Rooftops in Türkiye have a technical potential of 120 GW and can meet 45% of the country's total electricity demand. As of the end of 2023, Türkiye had an installed wind power capacity of 11.8 GW, while the NEP's 2035 forecast for wind power plants is 30 GW. Regarding Türkiye's 150 GW of wind potential, the target seems to be falling behind.

Can Türkiye utilise its rooftop solar potential?

Türkiye can utilise its rooftop solar potential to catch up with installation rates in EU countries and get on track to meet its clean energy targets. Rooftops in Türkiye have a technical potential of 120 GW and can meet 45% of the country's total electricity demand.

Does Turkey have a solar power plant?

Solar Energy In Turkey Turkey is deploying floating solar power plants on a massive scale to harness its extensive network of dams and reservoirs. There are currently 944 dams in operation, representing a reservoir area of 5,300 square kilometers.

How many solar power plants will Türkiye install in 2023?

In 2023, Türkiye installed 2 GW of new solar power plants. However, the country needs to double its current solar power plant installation rate by two and a half times and install 5.3 GW in the next two years alone in order to reach its targets. EU countries have demonstrated that this rate of deployment is achievable.

Turkey has also sought to strengthen the security of its energy supply by increasing production of renewable energy and reducing energy consumption through increased energy efficiency. Auctions, in particular, have proven successful in driving down costs and increasing investments in renewables.

Türkiye's largest source of clean electricity is hydro (22%). Its share of wind and solar (18%) is above the global average (15%). Türkiye relied on fossil fuels for 55% of its electricity in 2024. It is the largest coal power generator in Europe, although coal power is close to peaking. 61% of Türkiye's coal generation relies on imports.
