What is a battery-powered tool line?

What happens if a battery reaches 0 volts?

For deep cycle applications, if the battery holds under load for a few seconds, then voltage starts to drop steadily; this would indicate a problem with the battery. If the voltage instantly drops to 0 volts, that is also a problem. We call this the open cell.

How does voltage affect power tools?

In power tools, voltage is the equivalent of horsepower in a car. The driving force gets things moving, turning, cutting, or drilling. Think of voltage as the potential energy stored in your tool's battery. The electrical pressure pushes the current through the tool's motor. The higher the voltage, the more power the tool can deliver.

Battery Voltage Too Low. When a lead-acid battery consistently shows a low voltage reading, it's typically a sign of one of the following: **Deep Discharge:** If your battery drops below 11.8V, it is likely deeply

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discharged. Recharging the battery can restore it, but repeated deep discharges will shorten its lifespan.

Identifying a Weak or Failing Battery. A low OCV reading doesn't always mean immediate failure, but it could indicate an aging or weak battery. Gradual voltage drop over multiple tests -> Battery is losing capacity over time. Significantly lower than expected OCV -> Possible internal damage or high self-discharge rate.
