

Ukraine energy storage base project construction

DTEK has selected Fluence Energy (NASDAQ: FLNC) to deliver Ukraine's first large-scale battery-based energy storage portfolio, representing a EUR140 million investment. The project involves six energy storage sites across Ukraine, totaling 200 MW capacity and providing 400 MWh of dispatchable energy - enough to power 600,000 homes.. The project, scheduled ...

It will go toward the construction and grid connection of one project in the energy company's development pipeline, which it claimed will represent one of Ukraine's biggest battery energy storage system (BESS) portfolios when operational. The project's output and capacity were not disclosed in the KNESS announcement.

Fluence is understood to be supplying DTEK with energy storage systems for the construction of six energy storage power plants spread across multiple locations in Ukraine, with varying capacities up to a total size of 400MWh, enough to power 600,000 households (equivalent to approximately half of the households in Kiev) for two hours.
